Minister's Note

On Easter Day, we'll be celebrating the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead. The Resurrection lies right at the heart of our faith. And yet, even some Christians struggle to accept that Jesus rose physically from the dead, and prefer the idea of a spiritual resurrection.

There are various theories which claim to explain away the bodily resurrection of Jesus: his body was stolen or went missing; he didn't really die on the cross; he had a twin brother who either died in his place, or appeared as an impostor after the crucifixion; the witnesses of the resurrection were hallucinating or hypnotised; he rose spiritually rather than bodily. At first glance, each of these theories appears to provide a more likely explanation than the traditional belief that Jesus rose physically from the dead.

As Christians, we need to be convinced ourselves of Jesus' bodily resurrection. After all, as Paul writes, if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins (1 Corinthians 15:17). We also need to be prepared to make a defence to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you (1 Peter 3:15). There are various books which might help you with either your own convictions or your preparation for being asked about the Resurrection, including: Who Moved the Stone? by Frank Morison, The Case for Easter by Lee Strobel, Evidence for the Resurrection by Josh and Sean McDowell, The Evidence for the Resurrection by JND (Norman) Anderson, and The Son Rises by William Lane Craig.

Let's make sure that on Easter Day we can join in wholeheartedly and with absolute conviction with the Acclamation: Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
