God loves me. If you're a member of the human race, then God loves <u>you</u>. *This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life* for us (1 John 3:16). Love is not just something God does, it's what he is. He defines the true meaning of love. *God is love* (1 John 4:16).
