Minister's Note

A year ago, this nation was battered by a series of attacks following in quick succession one after another – Westminster Bridge Manchester Arena, London Bridge, Finsbury Park, Parsons Green Tube Station. And on top of all this, the Grenfell Tower fire. As the anniversaries of these horrendous events are rolling around, we are all reminded of them, and those who were directly affected are doubtless reliving their experiences.

We might well cry out, 'Why, Lord? Why didn't you stop these things happening? Why didn't you protect the innocent? Why do you allow people to suffer like this?'

We'll never fully understand why – at least, not in this life. But I hope we also ask the Lord to show us how he wants us to respond. The people of Manchester, and in London, especially around Grenfell Tower, came together in the aftermath, to help the victims in whatever way they could. Christians around the country prayed for them. We need to continue to pray, and to act. Pray for hearts to be changed, so people turn away from violence. Pray for the security services as they work to protect us from violent attacks. Pray that people are put before profit in all areas of life, especially in the construction of buildings. Be ready to support victims of violence or other disaster, and to do whatever we can to enable our neighbours to live in safety. As Jesus' followers, we are called to *proclaim good news to the poor . . . to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed* (Luke 4:18), in short, to be and to do Good News.

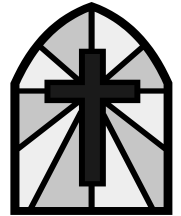
