Minister's Note

The world feels like a very dark place at the beginning of this new year. War continues in Ukraine (as well as in Yemen, Myanmar, Afghanistan, Mexico and Ethiopia, to name but a few); in our own nation, prices continue to rise, causing untold misery to so many people, strikes in the Health Service, on public transport, on our borders, and in the postal service each cause major disruption and have a knock-on effect on costs; and there is always the ongoing concern about global warming and the strange weather patterns we are experiencing across the world.

Into this darkness came Jesus. We have just celebrated his arrival: the true light, which gives light to everyone was coming into the world (John 1:9). No matter how dark the world seems, the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome/ understood it (John 1:5). We never dwell in darkness, because Jesus is always with us. And as his followers, our job is to reflect his light into the world: You are the light of the world, Jesus said (Matthew 5:14). He didn't envisage us each shining our light into our 'dark corner'; no, Jesus envisaged us shining into the darkness together: A city set on a hill cannot be hidden, he continues in Matthew 5:14. So as we step into 2023, let's seek to pray and work together to reflect the light of Christ into this dark world.
