Minister's Note

At this time of the year, it seems as if everything around us is growing! Trees and plants have fresh green leaves; lots of flowers are in bloom; the lambs are fast growing into sheep . . . In Church, we will soon be putting out the green hangings, etc, to remind us that this season (from the Sunday after Trinity through to late November) is the season for spiritual growth. The Sunday gospel readings focus on Jesus' teaching and ministry, and as we reflect on what we hear in those readings, so our faith is nurtured and grows.

As a Christian believer, I hope that you long to grow to maturity in your faith. A newborn baby has to be fed on milk, because that's all its stomach can digest. But as that baby grows up, so its stomach becomes able to digest solid food. Something would be very wrong for an older child or an adult to continue consuming only milk. Peter writes to the early Christians, *Like newborn babies crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation* (1 Peter 2:2). We are called to *grow up* in our salvation, and that means taking on board more solid spiritual food. Paul is exasperated with the infantile believers in Corinth when he writes, *I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, you are still not ready* (1 Corinthians 3:2). The writer to the Hebrews has a similar complaint in Hebrews 5:12-14.

We can't make ourselves grow – God gives the growth (1 Corinthians 3:7). But we can put ourselves into the right situation for growth to occur. We can attend Church services each week, asking God to speak to us through the Scripture readings and sermon. We can read a portion of Scripture each day, together with a commentary or Bible notes to help us understand. We can make it a priority to attend courses such as *Christianity Explored, Discipleship Explored, The Bible Course, The Prayer Course,* when the opportunity arises. We can read good Christian books, and we can spend time with Christian friends, learning together. The opportunities are endless; make sure you make the best of them, that you may become mature followers of our Lord Jesus Christ.
