Minister's Note

November is a month which includes a number of special services. On **Sunday 5 November**, the service at St James' will be the **All Souls' Service**.

Sunday 12 November is **Remembrance Sunday**, which will be reflected in services in both our churches; St John's will also hold the **Commemoration Service** at 6.30 pm that evening.

On **Sunday 19 November**, the Mission Area is holding a clergy 'swap-round' Sunday; Jonathan Smith will take the service at St James' that morning, and Dylan Parry-Jones will be at St John's in the afternoon. Meanwhile, I will be at Holy Trinity Rhostyllen followed by St Mary's Bersham that morning.

After all that, **Sunday 26 November** will see just our regular services! However, that evening there will be a **United Service** organised by Christians Together in Wrexham – details are below.

When I'm preaching, I often remind you that as followers of Jesus, we're all called to share our faith with our friends and family. That's not an easy thing to do! Recently I came across an idea from the Evangelical Alliance called *Motivating Mission: Using the 'Couch to 5k' model to empower evangelism in your Church.* I hope and pray that using this model will encourage many of you to join a group to learn and support one another, one step at a time. We'll start on **Monday 13 November**, meeting in person in the evening, and continue each Monday evening up to and including **Monday 4 December.** We'll then take a break and resume in the New Year.
