Minister's Note

It seems as if it's 'all change' at the moment! Of course, things change every day, in Church as well as in every other aspect of our lives. But just at the moment, there are some big changes happening, with the forthcoming closure of St James', and my move away from Wrexham.

Most of us don't like change, and most especially, we don't like change in the Church. We think of Church as being the one place which doesn't, or at least, shouldn't change; the one place we can rely on to be constant, consistent, unchanging. When big changes do happen, we can feel very anxious, insecure, unsettled.

But life in general, and the Christian life in particular, is all about constant change! In general, we should be learning all the time, from our experiences, and from our mistakes; it's good and right and proper that things change as we get older — otherwise, we'd all be living like newborn babies our whole lives. When we become Christians, we begin a lifetime of being changed by the work of the Holy Spirit, into the people God originally created us to be.

But we can be assured that God himself NEVER changes. You may be familiar with Hebrews 13:8 – *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever.* Other verses which assure us that God is unchanging include: Psalm 102:27; Malachi 3:6 and James 1:17. Equally, God's Word never changes. Jesus assures us that *Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away* (Matthew 24:35). *The word of our God stands for ever* (Isaiah 40:8). See also: Psalm 119:89, 111.

If you're feeling unsettled by the big changes which are coming upon us very quickly, take your anxiety to our unchanging, steadfast, loving heavenly Father. And remind yourself that even if everything around you changes or passes away, his Word remains as the sure foundation for your faith and life (cf Matthew 7:24-25).
